MEDICAL EMERGENCIES

All medical emergencies and sicknesses will be handled on the spot by the medical staff at Highland Lakes Camp. If there is a more serious medical emergency, your child will be taken to a local hospital for treatment and you will be notified immediately.

MEDICATION

Students must drop off their medications at check-in. ALL medicine must be in it's original prescription bottle with student's name on it. Please don't bring any over the counter medicine as the camp will have anything your child might need in their medical clinic. Please administer lunch meds as needed prior to student getting on bus at check-in.

Students will need to come to the medical clinic at the appropriate times during the day to receive medications. If they forget (which we know they will) our staff will track down the student to take them to the clinic.

SECURITY

We have thoughtfully considered and established all of our policies and procedures to keep every student safe while they are in our care. We are bringing our own security team, composed of volunteers.

TRANSPORTATION

We will be traveling to camp on chartered buses. Buses will be split between guys and girls to the best of our ability.

All buses are pre-assigned by group/friends requested. We will have adult leaders spread throughout each bus. We will show rated G or PG only movies on the buses. Once on the bus, students will not be allowed back off the bus until arrival.

All of our buses will be nut free so please keep this in mind when packing bus snacks.

MISSION EMPHASIS

Every year, we place a special emphasis on a ministry to highlight needs in our world. At camp this year, your student will have an opportunity to impact the lives of kids and students in South Africa. That region has been impacted by a lack of clean water and our camp mission offering will go towards supplying clean water. You can send money with your student to donate to this amazing ministry during camp.

SMALL GROUPS

The leaders in your student's small group will be background checked and trained by the campus Student Pastors. Small groups are campus specific and generally range from 10-12 students, plus adult leaders. Small group time is for discussion on the topics the speaker teaches on during worship sessions.

ROOMING

We are staying in bunk style accommodations. We ask that you have an important conversation with your student about respecting the things in their room. Any damages will be paid for by the student's family.

Dorms will be off-limits during free time and our security team will monitor the areas at all times. Should a student need access to their room, a leader or security member will need to grant them access and arrange for them to be escorted. Once students are in the room for the night, they will not be allowed to leave. Our security team will do a room check on all rooms each night to ensure all students are in their rooms.

We will work as hard as we can to make sure that students room with who they requested, but there are instances where it is necessary to go outside of those requests. We can promise that each room is created thoughtfully and prayerfully and your student will have an amazing week.

FREE TIME ACTIVITIES

Free time is between lunch and dinner each day.

WHAT TO BRING

- Lunch for bus ride to camp
- One suitcase
- Appropriate clothes (see **packing guidelines** for appropriate wear)
- Swim suit
- Light jacket
- Extra tennis shoes (in case they get wet during recreation time)
- White clothes you don't mind getting color powder on
- Drawstring type backpack, lightweight that you wouldn't mind losing
- Flashlight
- Sunscreen and insect repellent
- Water bottle Please mark the bottle with the student's name
- One bed pillow

- Bedding (sleeping bag or sheets/blankets)—Please
 put in a sturdy trash bag that is clearly labeled with
 student's name on it. Be sure to bring an extra trash
 bag for the trip home.
- Towels (bathing and swimming) and washcloths as none are provided
- Snacks/water for the bus ride
- Toothbrush & toothpaste, hairbrush, etc.
- Shampoo, soap, deodorant and other toiletries
- Some extra spending money for snacks, merch, souvenirs, money for mission offering, etc.
- Bible (with student's name and address in it) and a pen/pencil to take notes

PACKING TIPS

PACKING TIPS: HELPFUL HINTS

Our events are designed to strengthen your student's relationship with God. Please ensure they only bring clothing that is appropriate at all times. Any student wearing clothing that is deemed inappropriate by staff will be asked to change.

GIRLS' GUIDELINES

TOPS

- Tank tops and sleeveless shirts must be at least three fingers across on the shoulder.
- No shirts that show your belly button/stomach or low Vneck or scoop necks that might be revealing.
- No backless or one-shoulder shirts or "bro tanks" with large armholes.

BOTTOMS

- All shorts, skirts, dresses and rompers must be fingertip length. We have a NO ROLL rule for shorts.
- No shorts with writing across the backside.
- No shorts with holes.
- Leggings and yoga pants are acceptable ONLY if your shirt covers your backside completely.
- Pajama pants are not allowed outside of your room.

SWIMWEAR

- One-piece swimsuits are preferrable; holes cut out in the middle, see-through material, strapless suits, or suits that might be revealing are not allowed.
- A tankini is acceptable if the top and bottoms touch at the waist.
- No high-cut swimsuit bottoms
- A dark-colored shirt/tank top must be worn over twopiece swimsuits where top and bottom do not touch at the waist
- Shorts and shirt must be worn over swimsuit to and from the pool & waterslides.

BOYS' GUIDELINES

TOPS

- No shirts with inappropriate language or innuendos.
- No "bro tanks" with large armholes.

SWIMWEAR

- No holes or see-through material allowed.
- Shirt must be worn with swim trunks to and from the lake area as well as to and from rec and sports areas.

BOTTOMS

- Shorts must be fingertip length. We have a NO ROLL rule for shorts.
- Shorts with holes are not acceptable.
- Shorts and pants must cover underwear at all times—no sagging.
- Pajama pants are not allowed outside of your room.

CAMP RULES

By attending this camp, your student is agreeing to obey all the camp rules listed below. If your student chooses not to obey the rules, Lakepointe reserves the right to send a student home at the parents' expense.

- NO student or leader is permitted to leave at anytime without permission from staff.
- NO guns, knives, fireworks, matches, lighters, hair clippers, etc.
- **NO** cell phones (will be taken up if seen)
- NO iPads or any electronic games.
- NO tobacco, vaping, alcohol, or drug use of any kind by a student or leader.
- NO riding on or in any vehicles without expressed permission of the staff.
- NO guys in girl's rooms; NO girls in guy's rooms.
- **NO** one is allowed in the cabin without leader supervision.
- NO one allowed in rooms with less than three people.
- NO pranks allowed (or any items that might be used for pranks. EX: shaving cream, toilet paper, etc.).
- NO public display of affection.
- NO one is allowed outside of the rooms after lights out...NO ONE!!!

CELL PHONES

We do not allow Middle School students to bring cell phones to camp. Cell phones today are much more than just phones used to call home. We want to do our best to protect the environment that every student will experience at camp. By not allowing phones to be brought to camp we help protect that environment. We know this means you will have less contact with your student during the week, but we ask that you trust that we will do our absolute best to help your student have the best experience possible. Our pledge to you is that we will be quick to call you if there is any sickness or injury to your student. If there is an emergency and your student needs to call you, they can come to the camp office and we will get you in touch with your student as quickly as possible. We really believe that a week away from texting and social media will do all of our students some good. Letting go of their phone will be a difficult thing for many of our students, and there will be many that will be tempted to "sneak" their phone to camp. Please make sure that you as the parent are in possession of their phone when they leave for camp so that all our students can enjoy camp without the distractions that phones can bring. If we find a phone at camp we will keep it in the camp office and you will be able to pick it up at the medicine pick-up station at your check-in campus when the students return to Lakepointe.

DIETARY GUIDELINES

Highland Lakes Camp orders their Gluten Free, Nut Free and other food allergy related items from a reputable company named Gordon Food Service.

The Dining Hall Staff at Highland Lakes are professionally trained in accordance to Food Safety in the State of Texas. The Dining Hall Staff have completed Food Safety Courses and are knowledgeable about what to do for your specific allergy, which include:

- Changing gloves between touching different food products
- Assigning one to two people to focus solely on prepping/cooking/serving a particular food need
- Having clean cooking pots/pans/fryers/utensils for making food for a food allergy

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CHECK-IN INSTRUCTIONS

Grade 7 | 8 check-in is Friday, May 31st Grade 5 | 6 check-in is Wednesday, June 5th

- Check-in is at 11 AM at the appropriate campus
- Español Rockwall and Rockwall students will ALL check in at the Rockwall Campus.
- East Dallas, Firewheel, Forney, Mesquite, North Dallas, and North Dallas Español students will ALL check in at the Mesquite Campus located at 3540 Emporium Circle, Mesquite. There will be NO check-in at the other campuses.

See attached map of each campus for where to park and enter check-in. Do not park in the coned-off areas because the buses will be loading there!

- Leave your student's luggage in the car
- Enter the building at the marked entrances (see attached check-in maps)
- · Students will get their nametag and a wristband both of which must be worn at ALL times
- Once a student receives their nametag, proceed to the designated medicine check-in location (all medication MUST be checked in except inhalers) Please DO NOT bring over-the-counter medications. Prescription medications MUST be in original prescription bottle
- If dropping off meds, parent **must** fill out and sign a medication form
- Once medicine has been checked in (or if none) student may get their luggage, and get on their assigned bus.
 Bus assignment will be located on your student's nametag
- Once a student loads onto the bus, they will stay on the bus until departure, so be sure to encourage your student to use the restroom and give your goodbye hugs BEFORE they load onto the bus






