STAY UPDATED

Follow United Camp by downloading our LP Students app (available to download in the App Store or on Google Play by searching for **LP STUDENTS**). Stay connected and follow @lpstudents on Instagram to stay up to date with everything happening at camp! We share daily recaps, worship moments, speaker highlights, and more throughout camp.

Be sure your student subscribes to appropriate notifications in the app as we will utilize it for any schedule changes or updates.

TRANSPORTATION

We will be traveling to camp on chartered buses. Buses will be split between boys and girls to the best of our ability. All buses are pre-assigned by group/friends requested. We will have adult leaders spread throughout each bus. We will show rated G or PG only movies on the buses. Once on the bus, students will not be allowed back off the bus until the designated lunch stop. **EAT A GOOD BREAKFAST BEFORE YOU COME** and take your morning meds before you depart. We will serve Chick-Fil-A sandwiches for lunch on both travel days. We will have a handful of salads available for those students who are gluten free. **All of our buses will be nut free so please keep this in mind when packing bus snacks.**



MEDICAL EMERGENCIES AND MEDICATION

We are taking a team of highly trained paramedics and nurses who will care for the needs of your kids while at camp. They will also be following the buses to care for any needs that arise in transit. There is a hospital nearby in Santa Fe to deal with any major injuries that might take place, and our medical team will help coordinate the care of your student and the necessary communication with you. If you have specific concerns about your student's medical needs please contact Janey Shepherd at janey.shepherd@lakepointe.church prior to our trip. Our camp medical lead is John Minshew, and he can be reached at 214-458-5233 while at camp.

Students **must** drop off their medications at check in. ALL medicine must be in its original prescription bottle with student's name on it. Please don't bring any over-the-counter medicine as our medical team will have anything your child might need. Students will come to the medical clinic at the appropriate times during the day to receive medications. If they forget (which we know they will), our staff will track down the student to take them to the clinic. During the bus ride to and from camp, the medical team will follow the buses in order to administer medicine as needed and in cases of a medical emergency.

ALTITUDE ADJUSTMENT

Adjusting to the climate: We will be traveling to approximately 7,500 ft in less than 24 hours. The great thing is that we will be doing so by bus, and not by air, so the impact and transition to the body will be reduced.

How to help with the adjustment period: The answer is very simple, but is something that we need to help our students begin doing about three to four days prior to leaving, as well as on the bus ride to Glorieta.

- **Hydration:** This is probably the number one key in success! We will be encouraging them to maintain water-based hydration during the entire camp.
- **Carbohydrates:** As you pack snack foods and things for the bus ride, consider packing things that have a high carbohydrate content, if possible. If we can consume a high carb load on the way up to camp, as well as on day one once we arrive, the adjustment period will be greatly shortened and improved.

ROOMING & ACCOMMODATIONS

We will be staying in dorm style accommodations which hold 4-6 students per room. Leader rooms will be spread out throughout the hallways for good supervision. We ask that you have an important conversation with your student about respecting the things in their room. Any damages will be paid for by the student's family.

Dorms will be off limits during free time and our patrol team will monitor the areas at all times. Should a student need access to their room, a leader or patrol team member will need to grant them access and arrange for them to be escorted. Once students are in the room for the night, they will not be allowed to leave. Our patrol team will do a room check on all rooms each night to ensure all students are in their rooms.

We are staying in dormitory style accommodations that are much smaller than bunk style rooming. **We will work as hard as we can to make sure that students room with who they requested, but there are instances where it is necessary to go outside of those requests.** Being smaller means less students per room; however, we can promise that each room is created thoughtfully and prayerfully, and your student will have an amazing week.

MEALS

All meals at camp are prepared by Glorieta staff. We accommodate *most* allergies to the best of our ability. Please let us know **BEFORE** camp if there are specifics about your child. For questions or concerns, contact Janey Shepherd at the number listed above or at janey.shepherd@lakepointe.church. Concessions are available throughout the day and night at camp as well.

VOLUNTEERS AND SMALL GROUPS

Small groups are the most important and influential times at camp. Small groups are campus and gender specific and generally range from 10-12 students, plus adult leaders. Small group time is for discussion on the topics the speaker teaches on during worship sessions.

All volunteers are thoroughly screened through a background check and have completed ministry safe training. All volunteers will have detailed training completed by our student pastors and central team. We have thoughtfully considered and established all of our policies and procedures to keep every student safe while they are in our care. We are bringing our own patrol team composed of volunteers. They will patrol the grounds at all times, monitoring students' whereabouts.

WHAT TO BRING

- One suitcase
- Light jacket (*it will get chilly at night*)
- Appropriate clothes (*see packing guidelines*)
- Swimsuit
- Extra tennis shoes (*in case they get wet*)
- Lightweight drawstring type backpack
- Bible (with student's name in it)
- Flashlight
- Pen/pencil to take notes
- One bed pillow
- Bedding (sleeping bag or sheets/blanket). Place in a sturdy trash bag labeled with student's name. Bring a 2nd bag labeled for the trip home
- Sunscreen
- Insect repellent
- Water bottle (*with the student's name*)
- Towels (*bathing and swimming*)
- Toothbrush & toothpaste
- Shampoo, soap, deodorant, and other toiletries
- Hairbrush
- Snacks/water for bus ride
- Spending money for snacks, merch and mission offering

MISSIONS AND MERCH

Consider the following when sending extra money with your student to camp:

Every year, we place a special emphasis on a ministry to highlight specific needs in our world. Our mission project this year will support our ministry partners in Guatemala as they continue their work serving families and communities in need. Students can make a difference now by raising funds to support this effort, and their contributions will help provide resources, care, and hope that will impact lives for years to come. This is a wonderful opportunity for our students to extend the love of Christ to people beyond our borders and participate in what God is doing around the world.

We will be selling camp merch during the week (T-shirts, sweatshirts, pajama pants and squad bandanas) that your student can purchase. There are also snack bars and a Glorieta souvenir shop. We will take cash and credit cards for our merch but Glorieta is cashless.

If you purchase camp credit through Glorieta, it can only be used at their snack bars and souvenir shops. It cannot be used to purchase Lakepointe merchandise. If you have any issues with it you must contact Glorieta directly.

PACKING GUIDELINES

PACKING TIPS: HELPFUL HINTS

Our events are designed to strengthen your student's relationship with God. Please ensure they only bring clothing that is appropriate at all times. Any student wearing clothing that is deemed inappropriate by staff will be asked to change. Be sure to pack clothes to represent your squad color.

GUYS' GUIDELINES

TOPS

- No shirts with inappropriate language or innuendos
- No "bro tanks" with large armholes

SWIMWEAR

- No holes or see-through material allowed
- Shirt must be worn with swim trunks to and from the lake area, rec, pool, and sports areas

BOTTOMS

- Shorts must be fingertip length. We have a "DO NOT ROLL" rule for shorts
- Shorts with holes are not acceptable
- Shorts and pants must cover underwear at all times - no sagging

GIRLS' GUIDELINES

TOPS

- Tank tops and sleeveless shirts must be at least three fingers across on the shoulder
- No shirts that show your belly button/stomach or low V-neck or scoop necks that might be revealing
- No backless or one-shoulder shirts or "bro tanks" with large armholes

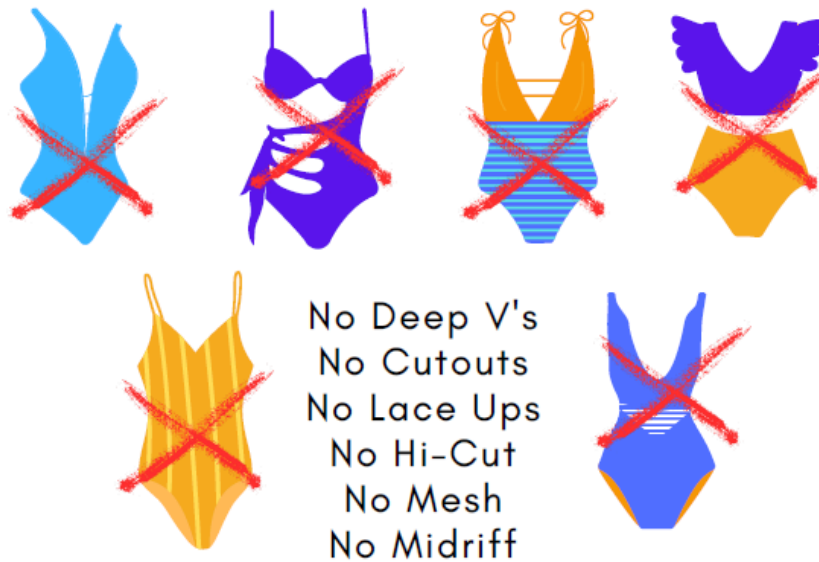
BOTTOMS

- All shorts, skirts, dresses, and rompers must be fingertip length. We have a "DO NOT ROLL" rule for shorts
- No shorts with writing across the backside
- No shorts with holes

SWIMWEAR

- One-piece swimsuits are preferable; holes cut out in the middle, see-through material, strapless suits, or suits that might be revealing are not allowed
- A tankini is acceptable if the top and bottom touch at the waist
- No high-cut swimsuit bottoms
- A dark colored shirt/tank top must be worn over two-piece swimsuits where the top and bottom do not touch at the waist
- Shorts and shirt must be worn over swimsuit to and from the pool and lake areas

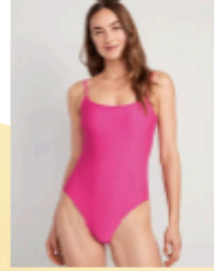
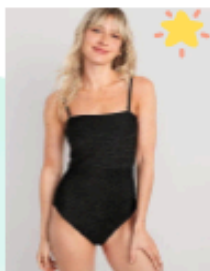

CAMP RULES

By attending this camp, your student is agreeing to obey all the camp rules listed below. If your student chooses not to obey the rules, Lakepointe reserves the right to send a student home at the parents' expense.

- **NO** student or leader is permitted to leave at any time without permission from staff
*If a parent is picking up a student, they MUST be signed out in the camp office
- **NO** guns, knives, fireworks, matches, lighters, hair clippers, etc.
- **NO** iPads or any electronic games or devices
- **NO** tobacco, vaping, alcohol, or drug use of any kind by a student or leader
- **NO** riding on or in any vehicle without expressed permission of the staff
- **NO** guys in girls' rooms; NO girls in guys' rooms
- **NO** one is allowed in the rooms without leader supervision
- **NO** one allowed in rooms with less than three people
- **NO** pranks allowed (or any items that might be used for pranks. EX: shaving cream, toilet paper, etc.)
- **NO** public display of affection
- **NO** one is allowed outside of the rooms after lights out....NO ONE!!!

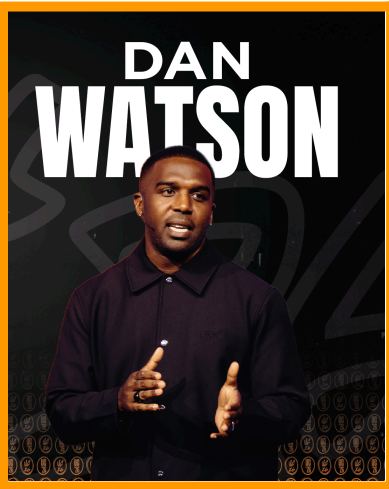

CELL PHONES

Night 2: Ed Newton

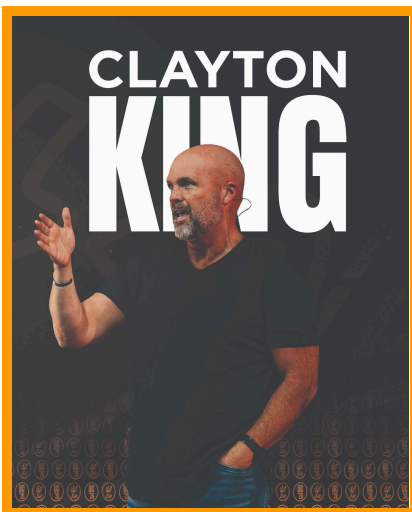

CHECK-IN INSTRUCTIONS

- Check-in is at 6:00 AM at the appropriate campus.
- **Rockwall, Royse City and Rockwall Español students will ALL check in at the Rockwall Campus.**
- **East Dallas, Firewheel, Forney, Mesquite, North Dallas, North Dallas Español and Sunnyvale students will ALL check in at the Mesquite Campus located at 3540 Emporium Circle, Mesquite. There will be NO check in at the other campuses.**

See attached map of each campus for where to park and enter check-in. Do not park in the coned-off areas because the buses will be loading there!

- **Leave your student's luggage in the car**
- Enter the building at the marked entrances (see attached check-in maps).
- Students will get their nametag which must be worn at ALL times.
- Once a student receives their nametag, proceed to the designated medicine check-in location (all medication MUST be checked in except inhalers) Please DO NOT bring over-the-counter medications. Prescription medications **MUST be in original prescription bottle with the student's name on it.**
- If dropping off meds, parent must fill out and sign a medication form.
- Once medicine has been checked in (or if none), student may get their luggage and get on their assigned bus. Bus assignment will be located on your student's nametag.
- Once a student loads onto the bus, they will stay on the bus until departure, so be sure to encourage your student to use the restroom and give your goodbye hugs BEFORE they load onto the bus.

*** Upon return, all medications can be picked up on the deck of The Pier for Rockwall or at the table in front of the main entry at Mesquite. ***
